 - ✓ Ensure that comments recieved on the draft versions of the document are duly disseminated and incorporated into revised versions of the document
 - ✓ Ensuring overall coherence of the SAP document

- ☐ Includes **representatives** from the CLME **Pilot Projects** and **Case Studies**
- ☐ Roles & Responsibilities (in collaboration with PCU & SAP consultants):

 - ✓ Short-listing of priority Actions for inclusion in the CLME SAP
 - ✓ Contribute to drafting components of the CLME SAP document

☐ Roles and Responsibilities

- ✓ Undertake critical analysis of draft SAP text providing suggestions and recommendations for improvements
- ✓ Where necessary provide suggested text for input into the document



The CLME National Focal Points

- ☐ Roles and Responsibilities
 - ✓ Ensure that sufficient consultation occurs nationally on the contents of the CLME SAP
 - ✓ Ensure that meetings of the inter-sectoral meetings are held to review and provide input on the SAP
 - ✓ Provide the CLME PCU with information on the composition of the inter-sectoral mechanism
 - ✓ Assist in identifying the Minister that would be responsible for endorsing the SAP



National Inter-sectoral Committees (NICs)

- ☐ Suggested composition:
 - ✓ Government Agencies and Departments (Fisheries, Environment, Foreign Affairs, Tourism,...)
 - ✓ Private Sector
 - ✓ Civil Society
 - ✓ Academia
- ☐ Roles and Responsibilities
 - ✓ Ensure that there is broad consultation on the overall content and components, and on the Strategies and Priority Actions of the CLME SAP
 - ✓ Assist with SAP endorsement



Key Partners: SAP Consultants

☐ Roles and Responsibilites:

✓ Develop and submit draft versions of the CLME SAP to the PCU

✓ Present content of the CLME SAP at relevant meeting forums (SAP CDT and Steering Committee Meetings)




